While it has taken us some time to say thank you, the truth is, it really is never too late to do the right thing. Which of course reminds me of a story.

Moish and Sara were clearing the old clothes from their closets. "Hey, look what I found in the pocket of one of your suits!" Sara called out, holding a claim ticket in her hand.

"What is that?" asked Moish.

"Apparently, you left some shoes for repair at the shop around the corner...10 years ago."

"You don't say," as Moish looked over the ticket. "I often wondered what happened to those shoes. Do you think they're still there?"

"I doubt it," Sara said.

Yes, we all share a very important part in creation, we must act now and do our share today, not next week, not tomorrow, but today to make this world a better place "ve-al kol yoshvei teiveil", ("for all who live on earth").

As we enjoy the sweet and wonderful cheese blintzes the delicious cheesecake and the sweet ice-cream sundae on Shavuot, let us make our mind up to find our ticket, the one that we put away years ago that allows us to do our part to make the world just a little better this year. As I reflect on the past few months, I wonder when this roller coaster ride will end. The ride I am referring to is the pandemic. At times, we were so hopeful that the number of positive cases was down, and folks were returning to a “normal” lifestyle. And then no sooner had we had that hope, numbers again began to rise. I want to share with you a situation that occurred to me. I am working at Chelsea High School where the mask mandate was finally going to be lifted on Monday, May 9th. On Friday, May 6th, the superintendent announced the mask mandate would not be lifted. On Monday at 10:00 AM, a group of students decided to protest as they left classrooms and walked around chanting, no more masks. I totally understood their frustration. However, as we all know, this COVID thing is turning our lives upside down. If we at TNT have to make last minute decisions, please do not get up during a service and protest. Just understand.

We recently hosted an active shooter training. Our own Peabody police presented an informative session where members of several synagogues and churches attended. I found the session to be informative and enlightening. I guess what struck me was the idea that even locked doors do not always provide protection. This statement is not to frighten anyone. Please trust me when I say that there are certain security protocols in place at TNT that cannot be shared. The security that you do not see provides the protection. Sometimes the door needs to be unlocked but that does not mean that someone isn't there ready and watching.

Our Religious School ended the year with a wonderful brunch on May 15th. We honored all students and teachers and especially highlighted our two graduates, Mandy Goss and Ryan Hinde. On the same day, our first youth group event was held featuring mini golf and ice cream at Richardson's.

Recently I received a grant application from Congregation Ahabat Shalom. The congregation has recently been dissolved as an orthodox house of worship. They have been given legal authority to re-establish as a donor advised fund the purpose of which is to honor and sustain CAS's legacy and values. The grant request must include how the grant will strengthen the organization, address the issues, make improvements and /or achieve success. I hope we can form a committee to brainstorm ideas for this grant. Please let me know if you are willing to help. The grant application is due on June 30, 2022.

There are many projects needed to be done. There is a classroom that needs to be cleaned out, a playground that needs some loving care, help with membership events, and of course ideas for activities, services, programs that will attract young and old.

Social Action, Elliot & Janice Wyner

Haven from Hunger update: For the last year we have been delivering meals to those who are homebound on Monday afternoons. With four families, we have each delivered once a month. During this time the upper floor at Haven, 77 Wallis St, Peabody, has been under construction with a new kitchen, dining area and offices for case work. Beginning in mid-April, meals are now being served in the new facility. Temple Ner Tamid has been asked to help with food preparation, serving and clean as we did prior to Covid. Our first serving date is Monday, May 9th, and we plan to continue on the second Monday of the month thereafter. All who would like to help are encouraged to join us, anytime that you are available between 3:15pm and 7:00pm. The food pantry also has volunteer openings between 8:00am and 3:00pm. Please let the office know of your interest and we will follow up.

Ma'ot Chitim – Selling the Chametz: At the Social Action Meeting in March, the committee reviewed prior years in which we have split the collection between two or three worthy charities. However, this year, with the dire situation in Ukraine, the committee felt rather than divide the proceeds, we should focus solely on helping those in Ukraine. After discussion it was decided that it would be best to donate the funds thru our local federation, CJP, to the Ukraine Emergency Fund. CJP has a close relationship with the Jewish leadership in Dnipro, a community of 40,000 Jews located in central Ukraine. Donations go to Dnipro and other Jewish agencies to provide emergency assistance to both Jews and non-Jews in Ukraine and to the refugees who have fled. Assistance includes food, shelter, medicine, and other basic needs. This year we received, almost double last year, over \$1850 in donations to go to the emergency fund.

Friday, June 3rd at Friday Evening Service, Brianne Jurs, Director of Community Outreach for Haven From Hunger will be our speaker.

Religious School, Susan Sugerman

Here's what's been happening in the Religious School...March-April-May Morah Alyssa (Hebrew)

Bet/Gimel students have been mastering their Hebrew letter and vowels. We have been timing them to see how quickly they can put the Aleph-Bet in order, from a scattered pile of letters. Using flashcards students have also been playing a game matching letters and vowels to make sounds.

Dalet/Hay students have been challenging themselves with their Hebrew reading. They have been playing a card game like "Go Fish" using Hebrew words.

In Vav/Zayin students have been working on a game board that they started a few years ago. They have been creating questions about things learned during their years in Religious School including: Hebrew, Tefillah, Holidays, Mitzvot, Bible Stories, etc. We hope to complete this activity by end of the year.

Morah Jocelyn (Holidays)

Students learned all about Passover. Each class discussed family traditions associated with Passover. Whether it was the kids putting on a Passover play for their family, getting unique prizes when finding the Afikomen, or showing off their Hebrew reading skills to their families. They all found one thing in common; that we all have Passover Seders! Then we dove into the story of Passover and practiced different parts of the Seder. (The oldest students learned the order of the Seder and the younger students practiced the four questions and learned about the 10 plagues.) The Dalet Hay class made their own wine glasses for Elijah and our Bet Gimel students learned the entire Passover story from beginning to end without forgetting any details!

From the classroom of Morah Andrea (Bet-Zavin Values/Mitzvot)

- Bet/Gimel/Dalet/Hey students thought it strange that the 10 Commandments were something we know we should do. We all agreed that to honor our parents, not steal and not murder are not things that we need to be reminded of. One student proposed an 11th commandment: "Thou shall not start wars." How appropriate that would be a great mitzvah and has great meaning and value to mankind.

Vav/Zayin students started working on their individual Bar/Bat Mitzvah journals. This was an exercise to learn about themselves and the challenges ahead. Most took this opportunity to think about their big day in a different way.

From the classroom of Moreh Dan (Bet-Zavin/Bible)

- Each class reviewed the different Jewish core values

we learned about throughout the past two years. Then as a class we decided on one or two to write a script and act out the core value as a skit. The students had a great time collaborating with each other, writing the script and were so thrilled to act out their skits to each other. Some of the values included: Forgiveness (S'lichah), Giving (N'tinah), Covenant (Brit), Justice (Tzedek), Leadership (Manhigut) and Courage (G'vurah).

- As a class, we discussed what community meant and how we are all parts of different communities such as school, family, sport teams/clubs. Each student then drew pictures of them within one of their communities. Great thought was put into these, showing our students participating in basketball and lacrosse teams, being happy with their families as well as many others. Each Bible class finished our celebrity leader poster projects! Many of them are hung up in the classroom for all to see and learn how some of our favorite Jewish celebrities and historical figures showed leadership through their courage, intellect and community giving/outreach.

From the classroom of Morah Beth and Morah Susan (Gan/Aleph)

We completed the Aleph Bet and every week students were creating a binder with the letters they learned and hints as to how they sound so that they may practice them even when not in school!

- Students created Purim Groggers made from empty tennis ball cans. They decorated them with lots of colored tape and filled them with beans. Wow, were they colorful and noisy!
- Students learned about Passover story and the first of the Four Questions. They also made square Matzah holders with Morah Beth's guidance. We hope those matzah holders decorated many Passover tables!






